***What's the significance of the Holy Spirit?
Why wasn't the Spirit more present to Jesus
during his life?***

Confused? You're not alone. To many, the Holy Spirit is the least-understood member of the Trinity, but there are insights to be gleaned from Scriptures.

The Spirit is prominent in the Old Testament, with many references. The "Spirit of God" is alternately seen as a divine force in the world, or as God himself acting upon the earth or individual lives. In Genesis, this force is active at the creation. History, too, is affected by the Spirit, or "presence" of the Lord (Exodus 33:14-17).

The Spirit is imparted to patriarchs, prophets, kings, and individuals who will shape history for the covenant people: Abraham, Joseph, Moses, Gideon, David, Ruth. The Spirit is also evident in the New Testament. The Spirit "overshadows" the Virgin Mary (Luke 1:35) and inspires the prophecy of John the Baptist (John 1:26).

The Spirit is an integral part of Jesus' mission, beginning with his baptism in the Jordan (Matthew 3:13-17; Mark 1:9-11; Luke 3:21-22). By the Spirit's power, Jesus expels demons and heals the sick (Matthew 12:28) (Luke 11:20). The Spirit is resurrected Jesus' gift to the apostles (John 20:22). Jesus' mission is complete when he sends the Spirit to the church at Pentecost (Acts 1:8; 2:1-4).

This brief review doesn't mean the mystery of the Spirit can be easily solved. God can't be fully explained, even by Scripture. Mystery invites trust, not comprehension! It's only when we give ourselves entirely to the Spirit's power in our lives that we begin to understand the significance of the Holy Spirit.

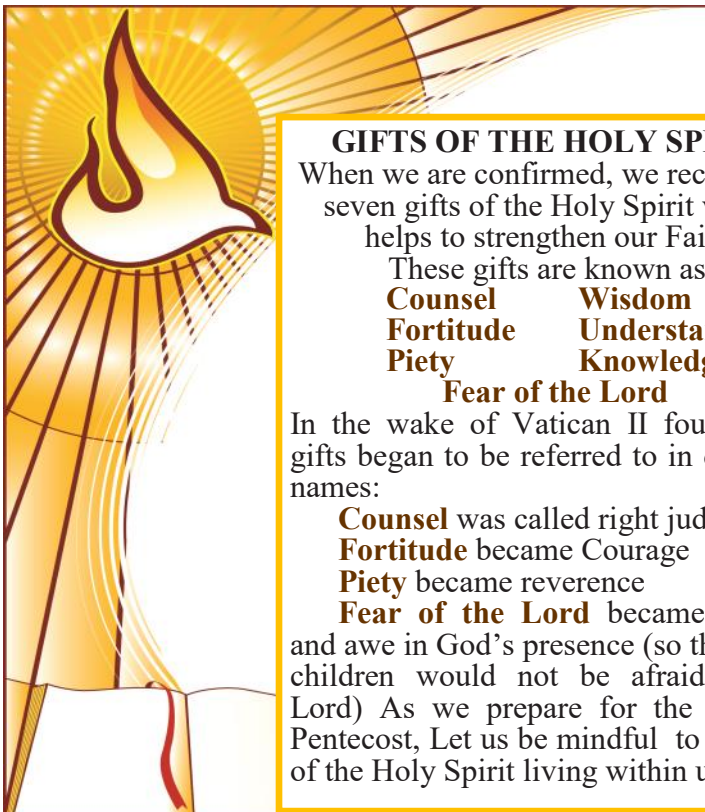

**Pope Francis Speaks to FAMILIES!!
The Church Is Everyone's Home**

In the family, everything that enables us to grow, to mature, and to live is given to each of us. We cannot grow up by ourselves; we cannot journey on our own, in isolation; rather, we journey and grow in a community, in a family. And so it is in the Church! In the Church we can listen to the word of God with the assurance that it is the message that the Lord has given us; in the Church we can encounter the Lord in the sacraments, which are the open windows through which the light of God is given to us, streams from which we can draw God's very life; in the church we learn to live in the communion and love light of God.

Each one of us can ask himself or herself today: how do I live in the Church? When I go to Church, is it as though I were at the stadium, at a football match? Is it as though I were at the cinema? No, it is something else. How do I go to church? How do I receive the gifts that the Church offers me to grow and mature as a Christian? Do I participate in the life of the community or do I go to church and withdraw into my problems, isolating myself from others? Everyone is a child of the Church, and in her all find their home.



GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

When we are confirmed, we receive the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit which helps to strengthen our Faith.

These gifts are known as:

Counsel **Wisdom**
Fortitude **Understanding**
Piety **Knowledge**
Fear of the Lord

In the wake of Vatican II four of the gifts began to be referred to in different names:

Counsel was called right judgement

Fortitude became Courage

Piety became reverence

Fear of the Lord became wonder and awe in God's presence (so that children would not be afraid of the Lord) As we prepare for the feast of Pentecost, Let us be mindful to the gifts of the Holy Spirit living within us.
