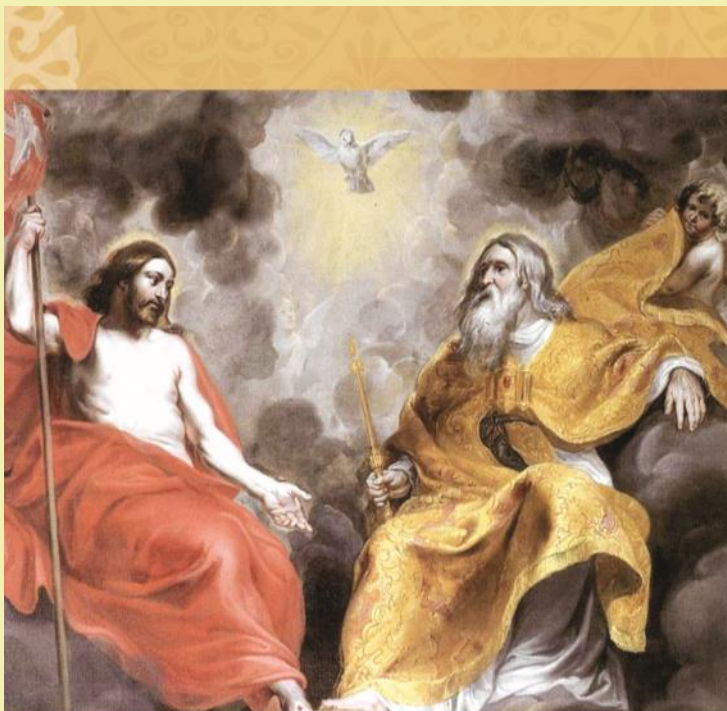

On June 4, 2019, Pope Francis appointed Bishop-elect Douglas John Lucia to be the 11th bishop of the Diocese of Syracuse. As bishop-elect, Bishop-elect Lucia will be the shepherd of over 222,000 Catholics who reside in seven counties of the diocese.

Bishop-Elect Lucia 56, of the Diocese of Ogdensburg will succeed Bishop Cunningham who has served the diocese since May 26, 2009. Bishop-elect will be ordained and installed at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception located in downtown Syracuse at a date soon to be announced.

Bishop-elect Lucia was born on March 17, 1963, in Plattsburgh the son of Leward and Betty (Pepin) Lucia. He and his twin brother and their sister and younger brother grew up in Altonia, NY

FROM THE PASTOR

Our faith in a Triune God offers us a pathway home to the Father, to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. Today, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. As we profess in our creed, we believe in one God, the Father almighty, in Jesus Christ his only begotten Son and in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of life. One God in three persons, in perfect, right relationship with one another. The three Scripture texts for our Mass today gives us insight into that Triune God, and demonstrate some of how they relate to us: the Wisdom of God, the human and divine natures of Jesus through whom we have peace with God, and the Holy Spirit of truth. Is there a simple way of understanding how I am to be a Catholic father?

I wish you and all fathers a Father's Day filled with God's protection of you and your family. May God surround you all with a circle of love! The simplest way to understand fatherhood is to pray the Lord's Prayer, the Our Father. This prayer was originally spoken in Aramaic, a language related to Hebrew. Aramaic was probably Jesus' native tongue. The word Jesus used for "father" was an Aramaic word: *abba*, which means "papa" or "dad."

When we say the Our Father, we speak to God in a very intimate way; we pray to God not as a distant figure but as a close and comfortable member of the family. It is this rather shocking intimacy that Jesus wants to get across to his disciples when he teaches them to pray.

As you relate to God in a very intimate way, you should relate in the same manner to your spouse and family. Intimacy means closeness, involvement, love, and understanding. As a father, you must be physically present in the home. But more than just a physical presence is necessary. You must also seek an emotional closeness with your spouse and children. You must show a constant interest in their lives. Encourage them by doing things with them. You must strive constantly to reject anger, rage, or an unforgiving attitude, and instead embrace gentleness, encouragement, and understanding. God the Father does all of these things for us.

**Pope Francis Speaks to FAMILIES!!
*You Are the Father!***

The absent father figure in the life of little ones and young people causes gaps and wounds that may even be very serious. And, in effect, delinquency among children and adolescents can be largely attributed to this lack, to the shortage of examples and authoritative guidance in their everyday life, a shortage of closeness, a shortage of love from the father. And the feeling of orphan hood that so many young people live with is more profound than we think.

They are orphaned in the family because the father is often absent, also physically, from the home, but above all because when they are present, they do not behave like fathers. They do not converse with their children. They do not fulfill their role as educators. They do not set their children a good example with their words, principles, values, those rules of life which they need like bread. The educative quality of the time the father spends raising the child is all the more necessary when he is forced to stay away from home because of work.

Sometimes it seems that fathers don't know what their role in the family is or how to raise their children. So in doubt, they abstain; they retreat and neglect their responsibilities, perhaps taking refuge in the unlikely relationship as "equals" with their children. Its true that you have to be a companion to your child, but without forgetting that you are the father! If you behave only as a peer to your child, it will do him or her no good.
